Assoc. Prof. Dr. Annop Pongwat has been the Dean of Faculty of Education at Chiang Mai University, Thailand since November 2005. Prior to taking this post, he served as an Educational Administration Program Instructor from 1982 to 2005. He is a Political Science graduate from Chulalongkorn University, spending a few years at the middle of the 1970s working with the Ministry of Education. A Ford Foundation scholarship took him to Stanford International Development Education Centre, Stanford University (1974-5) before proceeding to Florida State University (1975-1979) for his Ph.D in Developmental Studies in Education.

Dr. Mark Bray is Director of UNESCO's International Institute for Educational Planning (IIEP) in Paris, France. Prior to taking this post in March 2006, he had been Dean of the Faculty of Education and Chair Professor of Comparative Education at the University of Hong Kong. He began his career as a secondary school teacher in Kenya and then Nigeria, before moving to posts at the Universities of Edinburgh, Papua New Guinea and London. He has extensive consultancy experience for international agencies and national governments in Africa, Asia, the Caribbean and the South Pacific. He is the author/editor of over 40 books and 200 articles and chapters.

Mr. Albert Byamugisha is the Assistant Commissioner in the Education Planning Department, Ministry of Education and Sports, Uganda. He holds a Diploma in Education and a B.S. in Statistics from Makerere University, Uganda, as well as a Post-Graduate Diploma in Pure Science and M.S. in Statistics from Sheffield University, UK. He served as a Lecturer at the Institute of Statistics and Applied Economics, Makerere University between 1993 and 2000. He is currently a Ph.D. Candidate at Kobe University, Japan.

Dr. Joseph Chimombo holds a D.Phil. from Sussex University, UK. Formerly a Research and Evaluation Officer in the Ministry of Education in Malawi, he was appointed Director of the Centre for Education Research and Training at the University of Malawi in 2000. He was a Visiting Professor at Hiroshima and Kobe Universities in Japan in 2004 and 2005, respectively and he has worked on SACMEQ for many years, publishing many referred articles on education in local and international journals.
