Results and Field Knowledge for Education Quality Improvement

Institute of Education and Research (IER) organized week-long programme in Bangladesh on 24-30 November 2012 under Africa-Asia University Dialogue for Educational Development (Phase III). The objectives of the programme was to equip participants with critical skills for policy analyses to bring field knowledge of education practice or cooperation and research results as evidence into policy processes for education quality improvement. These skills included both bottom-up (evidence to policy) and top-down (policy-measures) skills.

Total number of participants was 11 from different countries who were officials of Ministry of Education and researchers in universities or equivalent organization - Burkina Faso (1), Papua New Guinea (1), Morocco (2), Niger (1), Nigeria (1), Pakistan (1), Philippines (1), Uganda (1) and Zambia (2).

The programme included follow-up training and findings sharing meeting on JICA activities in Bangladesh and Primary Education Development programme (PEDP-III) with officials of Directorate of Primary Education, visit of primary school and Primary Teachers' Training Institute (PTI) in Gazipur, symposium on quality education at Institute of Education and Research (IER), University of Dhaka where 5 field level officials of primary education were invited to share their field experiences, meeting with the Vice-Chancellor of University of Dhaka and so on.
