We are truly grateful to all of you for taking time off your busy schedule to attend the Japan Education Forum for SDGs. Filled ESD, educational ESD was implemented, promoted to contribute to the achievement of SDGs. For example, in the new course design, in order for children to become enablers of a sustainable society, new qualities and competencies must be achieved and that principle of designing education to enable such children has been implemented. More than 1000 UNESCO schools are available in Japan, providing an outlet for ESD and also to implement ESD in schools.

Schools and education committees will work together with the community to implement ESD. ESD will not only help to achieve number 4 of SDG, but all seven SDG goals. MEXT will continue to nurture talent who will enable a sustainable society and to contribute to the achievement of SDGs.

Today's topic is Quality of Education for SDGs and its challenges and realities of education policies. Goal 4 of SDGs is about quality education for all. We need to think what it means, and that is important. Today, as we move towards the common goal of SDGs through active discussion, the expectations from this forum is to enhance the quality of education, and eventually to contribute to the achievement of SDGs.

Last but not least, I would like to thank all of the stakeholders, organizers who have made this possible, and hopefully that this forum will become meaningful for all of you.
