Almost half of this training term passed. The workshops by Prof. Kazuhiro Yoshida were held.

In the morning session, 'Results chain' was held as 4th activity. Each pair of the trainees presented a results chain based on educational policies in Indonesia and Sri Lanka. This workshop was intended to analyze the core issues of the educational policy from the various information contained in the materials, and what kind of profits will ultimately be produced when policies are implemented. Since Prof. Yoshida did not specify detailed any examples or templates, the participants were struggling. However, because this training is so long, every group managed to respond to this task that had almost no hints. The outcome of the training may have already appeared.



In the afternoon session, Activity 5 was held by using cards. Cards on which education policies implemented by JICA and the World Bank were written, rang from nationallevel policies to on-site policies that become bottom-up, and trainees responded to questions and answers from other groups. Depending on the group, their roles were divided, and the discussions were smooth. They may have learned how to cooperate with others naturally by doing a lot of

group works.

Finally, several trainees had time to share their thoughts on today 's workshop. When the trainees expressed their impression that they said "It was very helpful. I would like to make use of them in the future." Prof. Yoshida advised them to bring back what they learned this time to their own country and how to make use of it. It will be difficult to get the answer right away, but it will be very fun to see how much they learned in



the last one month's training in the final announcement and how they will make use of them after returning



to their home country.
