She is co-editor (with Elaine Chase) of *Migration, Education and Development: Critical Perspectives in a Moving World* (Bloomsbury, 2022) and co-author (with Elaine Unterhalter) of *Education, Poverty and Global Goals for Gender Equality: How People make Policy Happen* (Routledge, 2017).
